GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS vs POST-SECONDARY REQUIREMENTS

Entrance course requirements for post-secondary institutions (PSIs) can differ from those required for graduation.

PSIs have lists of 'acceptable' or 'authorized' courses that are required for different programs. These are available on the PSI's website.

PSI have advisors and program information nights that can help provide information about what to take in high school.

Changes in PSI admissions happen often and can be confusing so ensure you are looking at current information.

Getting Started:

1. Visit www.myBlueprint.ca/sd38
2. Click **Sign Up**

Independent Directed Studies

Allows students to design their own course under the supervision and evaluation of a teacher at Palmer

Advanced Placement Courses

AP Chemistry, AP Calculus, AP Psychology, AP Physics, AP Biology

These courses are equivalent to first-year university level courses.

If you score 3 or higher on the AP exam you will receive University course credit.

Psychology 12

-opportunity to learn about the history of the field of psychology, psychological deviance, intelligence, group psychology, stress, personality, and psychological disorders

Sports Leadership 12

Responsibilities include - selecting and promoting activities, writing up rules, game schedules and results, providing PA announcements, setting up/taking down equipment, running the scorer's table, and refereeing games. Final teacher approval will be necessary for students to be accepted into the class.

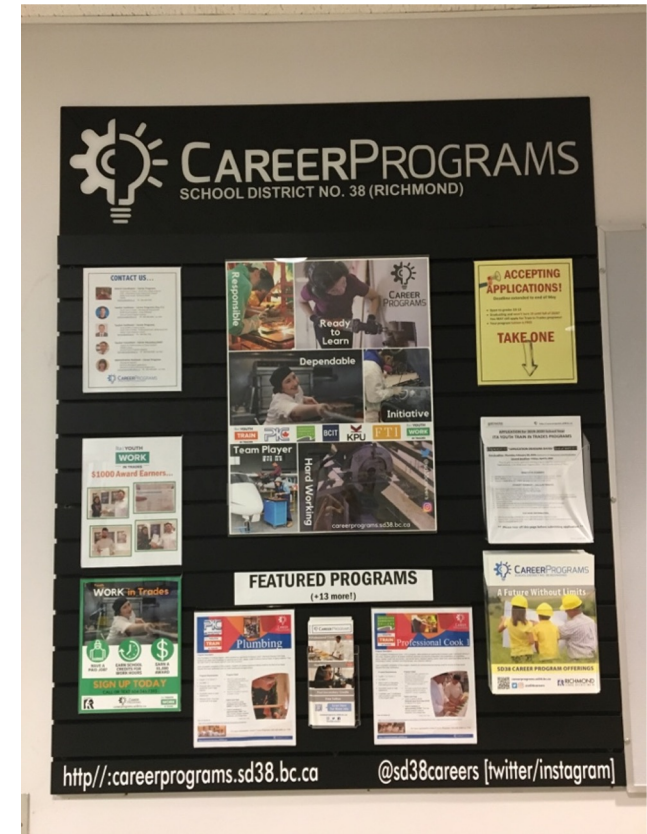

MYEDUCATION ENTRY

Students will need to choose their courses on a computer or mobile device as they did last year

STUDY AND OFF-TIMETABLE BLOCKS

- **Study Block** -you may select **one study block**
as long as you are on track for graduation- return the blue consent form with your Course Selection form
- **Off-Timetable blocks** are entered by counsellors once you have registered for an online course with RVS

You must complete **Permission Forms** for these blocks and have them signed by a parent/guardian and Counsellor.



Continuing Education

Offers **FULL CREDIT** (full curriculum) or **ACADEMIC COMPLETION** (students between 35-55% in Eng, Math, Science) options

Registration for **FULL CREDIT** is typically in **May**

Registration for **ACADEMIC COMPLETION** is typically in **June**

Students can register at ce.sd38.bc.ca or in person at the school district office

Richmond Virtual School

Offers **FULL CREDIT** (full curriculum)

Courses are delivered online with two in-person meetings weekly, depending on health and safety protocols

TIMETABLING PROCESS

- Counsellors review course selections to make sure students have made appropriate course selections.
- Course request numbers are generated (how many students selected each class).
- Administration makes decisions about what courses will run (considering required vs. elective, staff availability, projected new students)
- Administration make a schedule with the smallest number of conflicts possible (eg: Sc 9 INC and Eng 9 INC will not be placed in the same block)
- Counsellors look for students without an incomplete schedule and select alternates (counsellors only contact students if a significant change is being made)
- Counsellors update schedules in May/June (eg: failures, repeating ELL, not registered in planned summer course)
- Preliminary schedules are distributed in June (changes may still be required)
